REVIEW REPORT

TO THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF HEEP HONG SOCIETY

In accordance with the engagement letter dated 16 July, 2015, we have performed the agreed upon procedures in reviewing the attached income and expenditure account ("IEA") of Heep Hong Society's lottery event, the draw of which was held on 16 June, 2015. Our engagement was conducted in accordance with Practice Note 852 "Review of lottery accounts" issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants. This report is made solely in relation to the above lottery event and does not relate to any other part of the operations of Heep Hong Society. The agreed upon procedures that we have carried out did not constitute an audit of the attached IEA of Heep Hong Society's lottery event, and accordingly they cannot be relied upon to provide the same level of assurance as an audit.

Use of this report

This report is intended solely for the purpose of satisfying Condition 6 of Lottery Licence No. 4460 issued on 22 April, 2015 by the Home Affairs Department of the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region to Heep Hong Society, and is not intended to be, and should not be, used for any other purpose.

Review conclusion

On the basis of the results of the agreed upon procedures performed by us:

- a. in our opinion the attached IEA of Heep Hong Society's lottery event is properly prepared from the books and records of Heep Hong Society made available to us; and
- b. no matter has come to our attention which indicates that the attached IEA of Heep Hong Society's lottery event does not accurately reflect all the monies collected or received from the sale of lottery tickets by Heep Hong Society during the lottery event and all the disbursements made from the monies so collected or received.



NOTES TO THE INCOME AND EXPENDITURE ACCOUNT

FOR THE PERIOD FROM 22 APRIL, 2015

TO 16 JUNE, 2015

1. General

In accordance with Section 22(1)(a)(i) of the Gambling Ordinance (Cap.148), Heep Hong Society has obtained a Lottery Licence No. 4460 on 22 April, 2015 from The Home Affairs Department in respect of Heep Hong Society's sale of raffle tickets held for the period from 22 April, 2015 to 16 June, 2015. The draw of the lottery event was held on 16 June, 2015.

2. Basis of preparation

The income and expenditure account has been prepared on the cash receipts and disbursements basis. On this basis, income is recognised when received and expenditures are recognised when paid.

3. Surplus

The total surplus of HK\$1,303,794 will form part of revenue of Heep Hong Society. The executive committee have determined to use the surplus in support of its services for children with special needs and their families.
